### SURVEY FARMERS' VIEWS OF THE RURAL PAYMENTS AGENCY'S SINGLE PAYMENT SCHEME FOR THE NATIONAL AUDIT OFFICE

# Final Topline Results 04/07/06

- 1,000 telephone interviews were undertaken with farmers in England who applied to the 2005 Single Payment Scheme.
- Fieldwork took place from 9<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> June 2006.
- Quotas for the fieldwork were set by government office region and farm size, on the basis of the known profile of the population of applicants. Quotas were also set on level of deprivation (Severely Disadvantaged Areas [SDA] or not SDA, as provided by the NAO), and whether or not applicants had received their entitlements. These quotas aimed to ensure that SDA farms and unpaid applicants were sufficiently represented in the sample in order to allow comparisons between sub-groups of paid/unpaid and deprived/ not deprived farmers. All quotas were achieved.
- Weights have been applied for levels of deprivation, receipt of the entitlements, government office regions and farm size.
- Base for each question is all 1,000 farmers interviewed unless otherwise specified.
- Where figures do not add up to 100%, this could be the result of computer rounding or multiple answers.
- An asterisk (\*) indicates a score less than 0.5%, but greater than zero.
- Figures are usually given as percentages. However, where they are less than fifty, actual numbers are used: they are italicised.
