EQUITABLE LIFE PAYMENT SCHEME

Thank you for your request of 1 December 2022 in relation to the C&AG Report of 24 April 2013: Administering the equitable Life Payment Scheme. You have asked for us to handle your request in accordance with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

The specific information you requested states:

"Have the Comptroller or Auditor General ever considered this Ongoing Deception of Parliament or does Gareth Davies have any views on the matter?"

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires public authorities to provide the information which they hold at the time of a request where it is applicable, and lawful and is not exempt. It does require public authorities to create information or to respond to questions about the interpretation of the law or guidance or provide views or opinions on any subject matter. However, having searched our audit records, we can confirm that hold some information within the scope of your request. We thought the following information might be helpful.
