Annex A

Request for information about destroyed vaccines.

(Your request in italics, NAO response in plain text)

The National Audit Office has previously stated that 4.7 million (4%) of vaccine doses have been destroyed nationwide since the vaccination programme began: <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/health</u>

Please can I have the number of vaccine doses that have been destroyed in Nottingham, Nottinghamshire, Derby, and Derbyshire since the start of the vaccine rollout (December 2020) to the most recent data available?

Can these please be presented as totals for each city/county and by districts. If possible, could the reason for their destruction be also included, as well as how many vaccines have been administered in each area?

Following the acknowledgement email that we sent you on 29 April, you confirmed on 1 May that our interpretation of your request was correct – i.e. that your request is about Covid-19 vaccines.

NAO response

We can confirm that we do not hold information in scope of your request.

All the data we hold is at a national level without local breakdowns. We analysed data on vaccine wastage up to the end of October 2021 which is summarised in paragraphs 2.17 to 2.19 of our report: <u>The rollout of the COVID-19 vaccination programme in England</u>.

The data we hold in relation to the reasons for wastage or destruction, are also at national level and are summarised in the same paragraphs. Additionally, you may find the weekly vaccination statistics from NHS England helpful. The data is available at <u>Statistics » COVID-19 Vaccinations (england.nhs.uk)</u>. The most recent data available <u>COVID-19-weekly-announced-vaccinations-19-May-2022.xlsx</u> covers the period up to 15 May 2022, and includes some regional and local details.
