COST BENEFIT RATIO FOR THE CARLISLE SOUTHERN LINK

Thank you for your request of 24th April 2023 in relation to the cost to benefit ratio for the Carlisle Southern Link.

Your request was considered in accordance with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Your specific request is reproduced in **Annex A** on page two for your reference.

We have carried out a thorough search for the information you requested, and we have established that we do not hold the information as it is not recorded as part of the work the National Audit Office (NAO) carry out.

The publicly available council web page regarding the project explains that the Carlisle Southern Link Road is being delivered by the local authority 'Cumberland Council' and not by central Government. Further details can be found on the project page using the following link <u>Carlisle Southern Link Road (CSLR) | Cumberland Council</u>.

The NAO has no remit or powers to investigate matters or the actions of individual bodies such as Cumberland Council. Local authorities such as councils are separately and locally accountable and as such do not fall within the scope of the NAO.
