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NHS CONSULTANTS WHO HAVE DECLARED TO DO PRIVATE WORK

Thank you for your request of 23 August 2023 for data about NHS consultants who have declared to do private work. We have handled your request under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). Your specific request is set out in **Annex A** for reference.

We have searched our records and can confirm that we do not hold the information that you requested.

As you may know, our <u>Managing NHS hospital consultants</u> report published in 2013 did reference the extent of private practice work done by consultants. This was based on findings from surveys of hospital consultants and NHS trusts carried out by the NAO specifically for the study. The report also referred to previous surveys undertaken by the then Department of Health (now Department of Health and Social Care). However, as with almost all our studies, we do not collect data after studies have finished and we have no reason or plans to collect any of the data within the scope of your request.

I am sorry that we don't hold the specific information that you requested on this occasion, but I hope you find the explanation in this response helpful. **Annex B** sets out the steps you may wish to take if you are not satisfied with the way we have handled your request for information under FOIA.

Request for data about NHS consultants who have declared to do private work:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 I would like to request a disclosure of the following information:

- the number of NHS consultants who have declared to do private work as part of their job plan out of all consultants employed in the NHS

- the demographics of the consultants (age, gender, ethnicity) who have declared to do private work and have declared not to do private work

- the specialties the NHS consultants practice in who have declared to do private work and have declared not to do private work

- the hours of private work that were declared per consultant

- the amount of income from private work that was declared per consultant in GBP

Can you please provide this data per year for the years 2018 to 2023 and in a spreadsheet. If available, please provide a breakdown of the data by NHS trust. Thank you and I am looking forward to hearing from you soon.
