MILLENNIUM DOME

Thank you for your email on 4 November 2024 asking for information in relation to the sale of the Millennium Dome. You specifically requested 'a detailed breakdown of all sums recovered by the government in relation to this project on an annual basis as well as providing the total sum recovered as at today's date.' Your request has been handled under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

We have searched our records and can confirm that we do not hold the information you requested. It might be helpful to explain that *the "National Lottery Community Fund took over the remaining property, rights and liabilities of the Millennium Commission following its dissolution in 2006. The Fund is entitled to a share of the proceeds of land sales on the Greenwich Peninsula made by the Greater London Authority once certain costs have been covered. Payments of £50.3 million (2022- 23 £55.2 million) are now forecast to be received between 2016 and 2044, of which £10.5 million has been received by the end of 2023-24. No additional income has been accrued for 2023-24."*
